We bring the second issue of this volume of the **Journal of Science & Technology Metrics** with below research.

The authors *Shiva Kanaujia Sukula, Shipra Awasth* in their opening paper on “**Scholarly Communications across the Globe: Practices and Enrichment of Learning**” have studied the status of ETD, services, and embargo policies followed by some selected institutions. Besides this work have given a view of the data published in various journals indexed in the Web of Science database. To study they took a long window of 12 years from 2009.

In the second paper on “**A Bibliometric Analysis of Dengue Fever Publications in Malaysia (1981-2017)**”, the authors *Yanti-Idaya A.M.K, Nordiana A.K.S, Noorhidawati A., Mike Thelwall* have analysed the dengue-related publications from Malaysia. The study have examined the growth, prevalence, and subjects of published journal articles. This study took a collection of articles published in PubMed database and indexed in the WoS Core Collection. The work has lead to generate a bibliometric profile of scientific publications.

In the next paper on “**Russian Contribution to Research on Virology: Bibliometrics Analysis, 2000-2019 on Web of Science**”, the author **Valentina Markusova** took the publications of the three organizations that produced vaccines available for inoculation against COVID-19 in Russia and analysed them. The metadata was retrieved from the Web of Science (WoS) Core Collection and InCites (Clarivate Anal.) This work has given insights into important research development on virology through empirical analysis of Russian publications from 2000-to 2019.
